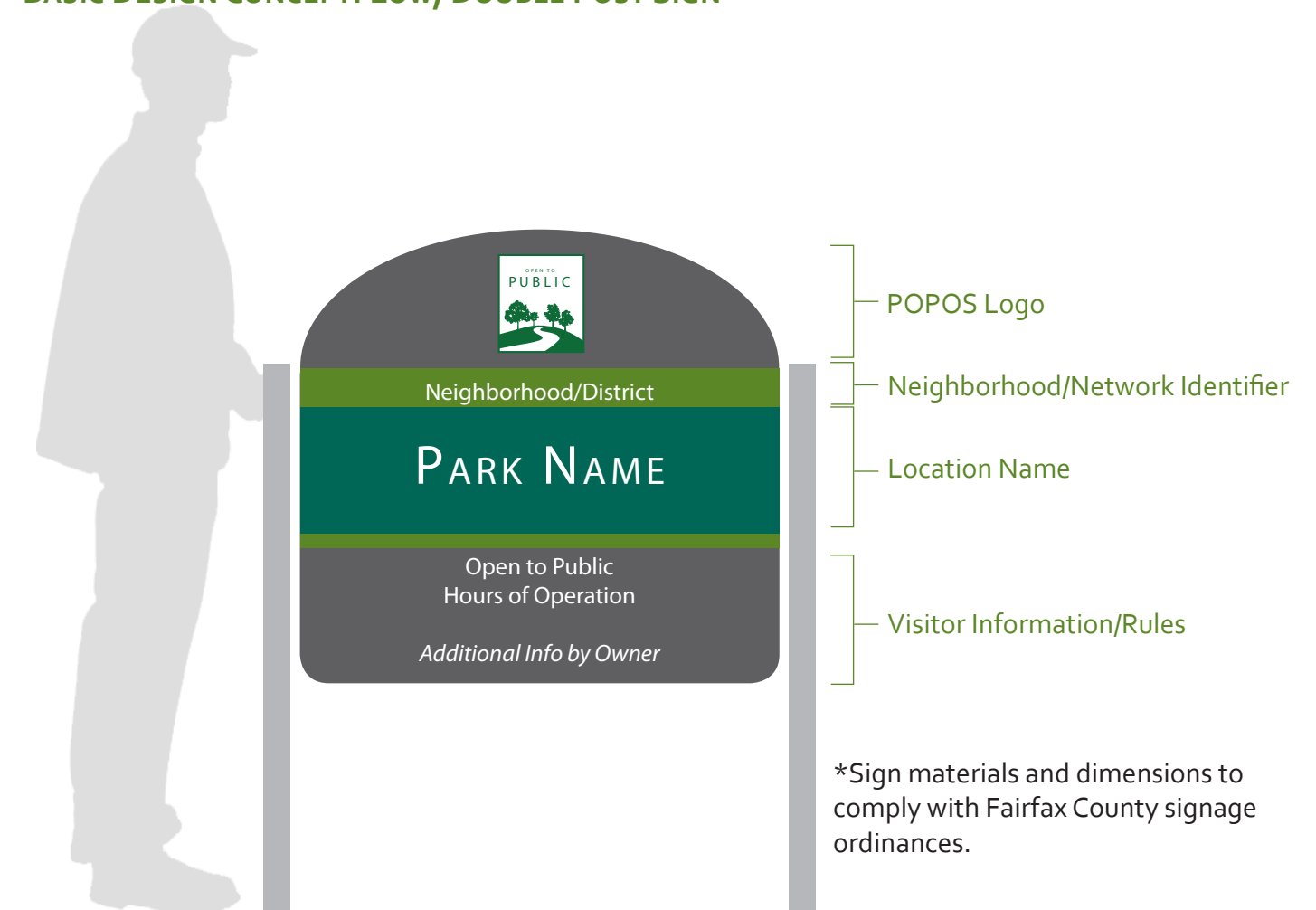
PARK ACCESS SIGNS

Overview

PURPOSE

The Park Access Sign is the primary sign that identifies the space as public and part of the County's privately owned public space system. A minimum of one park access sign is required for every privately owned public space. The plaque should be located within five feet of the public sidewalk or accessible pedestrian space. The plaque must contain the "POPS" logo, neighborhood identifier, park name, "Open to Public" text, and hours of operation. Any other information is at the discretion of the owner and can be added at the bottom of the sign.

BASIC DESIGN CONCEPT: LOW, DOUBLE POST SIGN



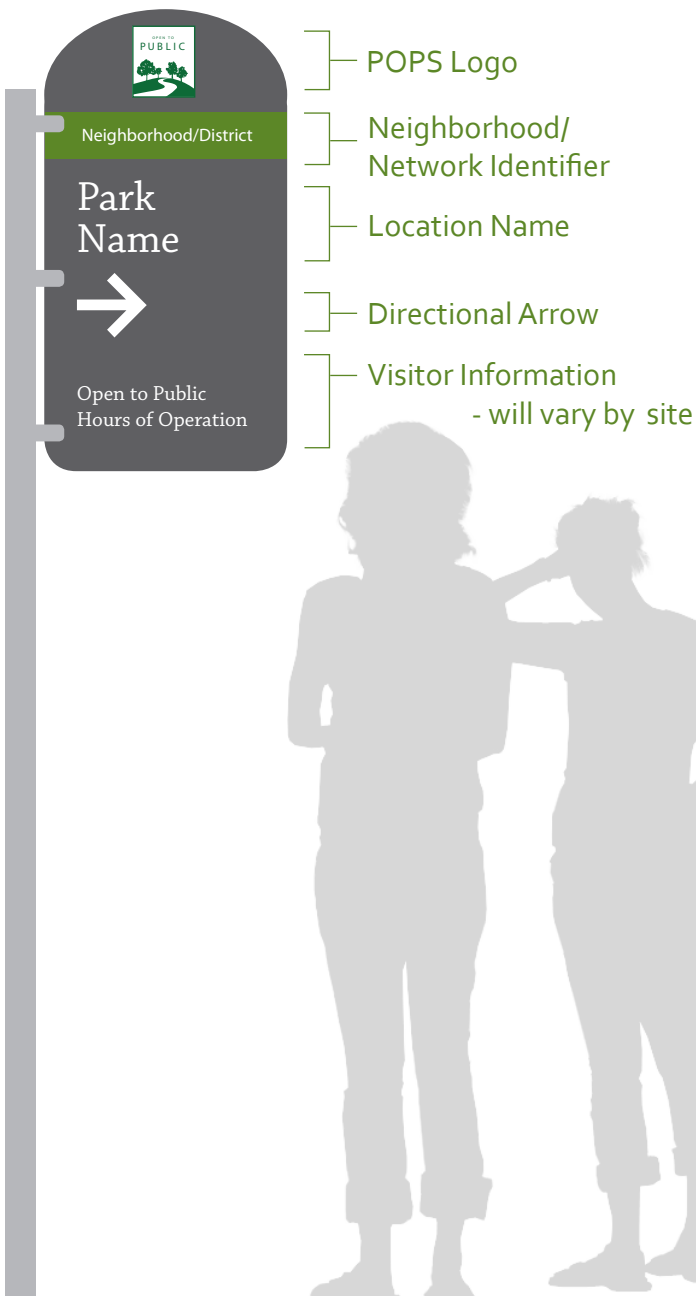
PARK ACCESS SIGNS

Overview

PURPOSE

Park Access signs are intended to direct the public to public spaces or points of interest throughout the County. They are intended for primarily pedestrian areas, although there may be instances where vehicular applications are appropriate, such as entry drives.

BASIC DESIGN CONCEPT: SINGLE POST VERTICAL WAYFINDING-TYPE SIGN



SIZES

- Sizes will vary by type and location
- Size and location to comply with Fairfax County Signage Ordinances

MATERIALS

- Aluminum (such as 0.80" thickness) - for signs up to 36" in any dimension
- Aluminum composite - for signs 36" or larger in any dimension
- Text printed with reflective face

USE AND LOCATION

- Entrance Drives
- Trail/Walkway Crossings
- Location and placement to comply with all county and state regulations

TRAIL BLADES

Overview

PURPOSE

Trail Blades offer a space-efficient way to provide trail information. Each blade is double-sided and provides basic trail information including:

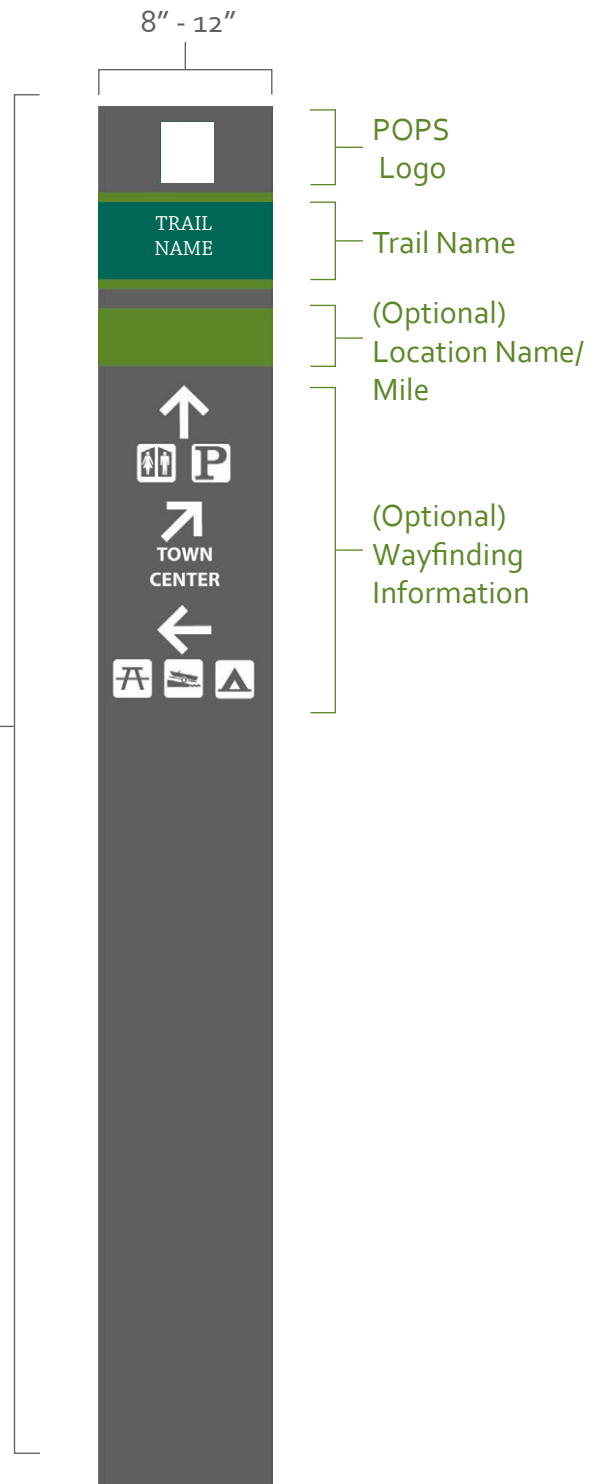
- POPS Logo
- Trail Name
- Optional Current Location
- Optional Directions to Amenities

BASIC DESIGN

Blades are typically double-sided, using the same format on both sides, changing wayfinding information as necessary.

Some blades, such as those found mid-trail, may not need to include some information, such as the wayfinding information or location name.

PURPOSE

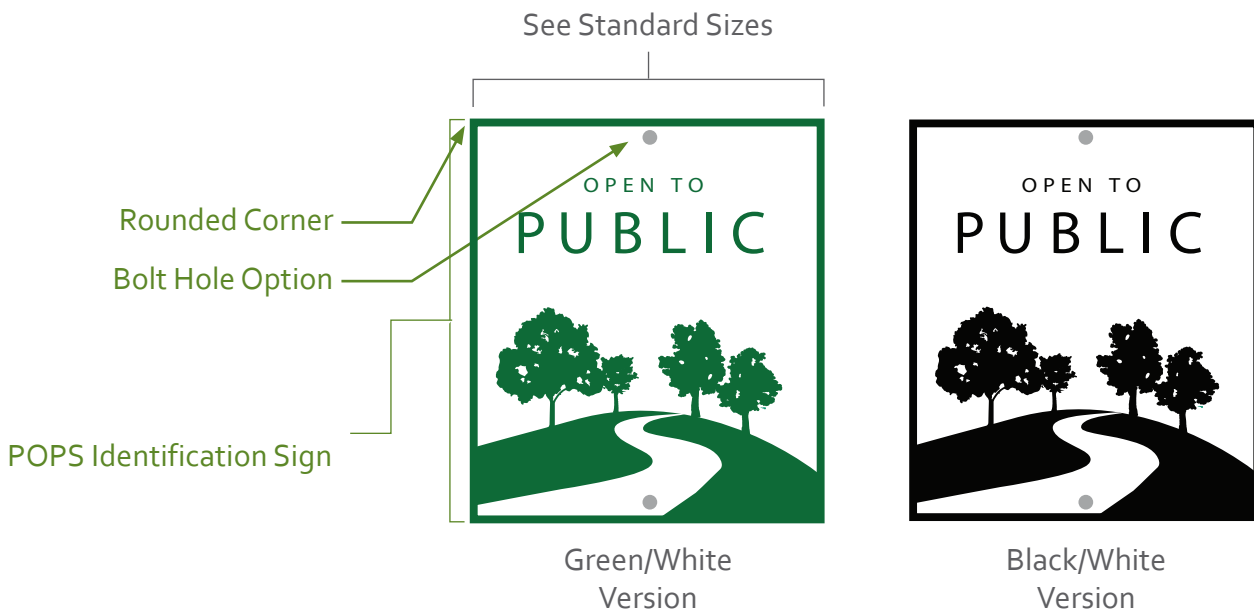
PRIVATELY OWNED PUBLIC SPACE (POPS) IDENTIFICATION SIGNS

POPS Identification Signs identify and promote the many important public spaces that constitute the Fairfax County Public Space Network.

These simple identification signs are the most basic, most easily replicated and most immediately recognizable of all the sign types. They can be scaled to fit any situation and can be installed alone or attached to existing signs at any point of interest.

POPS IDENTIFICATION SIGN - BASIC DESIGN

To be used at points of interest within the system.



STANDARD SIZES

The POPS Identification Sign is fully scale-able for various applications; however, typical dimensions include:

- 6" x 8"
- 9" x 12"
- 18" x 24"

MATERIALS

- 0.80" thick Aluminum
- Reflective Fluoride Resin Laminate (U.V. Resistant)
- Alternate materials (plastic/polymer)
