All other weeds and vines pulled out










Patio & Terraced Garden

Volunteers used clippers to trim back vegetation and remove invasive species, and break down the debris for disposal.




Volunteers recovered an old planting bed by cleaning out trash, weeds, decomposed leaves, and replacing with fresh mulch.





